

Our Kindergarten is proudly managed by ECKA Inc. ECKA is called the Approved Provider and is responsible for all aspects of the management of the preschool including employment of staff. Information about ECKA can be found at www.ecka.org.au and you will receive an ECKA policy and procedure booklet when you commence.

ECKA is a not-for-profit community based Early Years Management Service for kindergartens and early childhood care services in Ballarat and surrounding areas, proudly managing 28 services. While all kindergartens operate within Legislative guidelines, each kindergarten operate an individual program to meet the needs of the children and families attending their service. ECKA values the role the kindergarten in building local support networks with families, often contributing to lifelong friendships between the families and children who have shared their kinder years together.

PHILOSOPHY

We celebrate children's individuality, culture and abilities ensuring each child feels valued and has a sense of belonging. Children are provided choice, time, space and challenges to support them in reaching their full potential. This is achieved by the educators who are committed to fostering self-esteem and wellbeing, whilst scaffolding individual needs and development to create the foundation of life learning.

Providing inclusive indoor and outdoor educational environment that inspire and value play based learning; offering a nurturing, creative, respectful and enjoyable space which allows children to explore and extend on their interests. We acknowledge our environment as a third teacher, providing opportunities for appreciation and respect of sustainable practices, fauna and flora.

Our environment and teaching practices are influenced by a variety of theorists, such as Malaguzzi, Montessori, Vygotsky, Gardener, Piaget and Bronfenbrenner. These theorists guide a positive environment that promotes scaffolding, educating, inclusion, exploration, wonder, development of milestones and engaging with nature and the natural world.

We recognise and value the input our various stakeholders have in our kindergarten: Therefore, the integrated relationships we develop not only support our families but extend to the wider community; such as our Local Schools, Therapists, ECKA, The Education Department, Charities and Other Community Organisations.

PROGRAM

The curriculum offered at Delacombe Community kindergarten is structured on the Victorian Early Years Learning and Development Framework, and the Early Years Learning Framework for Australia. We take into account the interest of the children and we plan intentional teaching to facilitate learning.

During the kindergarten year, we focus on facilitating the development of the whole child. This includes – communication (speech and language), wellbeing (fine and gross motor development,) Identity, community and learning (cognitive development). We value the input and knowledge that each child and family come with and meet with families to discuss and further each child.

Here at Delacombe Community Kindergarten we value the outdoor play space as much as the indoor, we also value risk and challenging play. The children will be outdoors majority of the terms. We ask that you please provide suitable clothing during each season and spare clothing. We provide the children with loose parts to play with, the mud kitchen and other areas for exploration. Each season brings with it an enormity of learning opportunities despite what us as adults feel.

PORTFOLIOS

Each child in the 3 and 4 year old programs will be provided a Portfolio. Information, observations, learning stories, project work, assessments, midyear summaries and some art work is included in these. This collection of work is valued by both the educators and the children.

Throughout the year we offer open mornings/afternoon to view the portfolios. (Please note: 3 years old's do not take their portfolio home at the end of their kinder year. This is carried over to the four year old year.)

STORY PARK

Story park is an online documentation program that can be accessed through an app on your phone or on your desk top. Through this program educators will post stories and events on your child's page where parents and families have the opportunity to view and comment. Educators also use this software to plan for their groups, for individual children, send community posts to families about possible events or notices, newsletters and important reminders.

Parents can also use this software to message staff individually to inform them of a child's absence, sickness etc. It even has a section where parents can add their own photos and comments about their children's weekend or holiday experiences for educators to see, bringing their home experiences into the kinder.

ARRIVING & DEPARTING

Your child's prospective room will open the door at either 8:30 or 9:00 am. Each room has a sign- in book that must be completed by the parent or carer each day on arrival and departure. This book will either be located in the room or at the entrance door of the room. You will be informed of this prior to starting. This book is one of our legal documents so it is important to enter the correct arrival and departure times.

On your enrolment form you will have listed people that you allow your child to go home with. If for any reason a person comes to collect your child and their name is not listed on this form, they cannot leave the Kindergarten with them.

In this case when you know someone other than yourself is collecting your child please see staff to check if the person is listed.

Staff may request photograph ID to be shown to ensure that your child is going home with the correct person.

If you happen to be delayed when collecting your child, please telephone the Kindergarten (Please DO NOT text us) to let us know so we can explain the situation to your child. Children may become worried if they do not know where you are and why you are late. Ongoing lateness for collection will be discussed with ECKA and a fee may be added to your account.

THE KINDERGARTEN GATE

We take the safety and education of each child in our service very seriously, and so does ECKA. Upon enrolment each family is provided with a contract to say you too take this procedure very seriously. We ask that once you collect your child from their Kindergarten room you are holding their hand and are supervising them at all times.

Please ensure that the foyer door and outside gate is firmly closed behind you and only take through the gate your own children. In this instance of the gate please be assured you are not being rude or inconsiderate for not holding the gate open for others. It is imperative that children other than your own do not go out the gate.



CLOTHES AND BELONGINGS

At Kindergarten, children are encouraged to become involved in a variety of activities, which may sometimes be quite messy. Although we provide smocks, it is inevitable that children may still get dirty. Therefore, we recommend that you send your child along to Kindergarten in sturdy, washable clothes so they are free to "explore, experience, discover, and enjoy" without the fear of getting their clothes dirty.

It is not compulsory, but we do offer a Kindergarten jumper and Kindergarten polo top. Please see staff for purchase.

Currently these items are \$20 for polo top, \$25 for jumper and hats are \$12.

Please name clothing. Please appreciate that when children are wearing all the same top and jumper we cannot tell them apart when they are not named.

To align with the sun smart policy we recommend no singlet tops or singlet type dresses to be warm. We would prefer children's shoulders to be covered.

In cold weather such as winter we do go outdoors every day, therefore a beanie and coat is necessary.

Please provide spare clothes – this is not only for toileting accidents but other learning incidents can happen throughout the day.

Children may have an accident when toileting or become wet during water play feel more comfortable if they are wearing their own clothes. We do have a small amount of spare clothes at the kindergarten to provide your child if they need to change.

Please wash and return any spare clothes that your child may have used.

SUNSCREEN

In keeping with our Sunscreen Policy all parents are requested to apply sunscreen to their child prior to the session. We do have sunscreen available in the kindergarten if you forget to apply some at home. Any allergies to sunscreen must be reported to staff and the child's own sunscreen supplied please.

FOOTWEAR

To reduce the risk of injury to your child's feet whilst playing in the kindergarten yard, we request that your child attends kindergarten in closed toe shoes. Please avoid dressing your children in thongs or crocs.

HATS

Every child is required to have a broad brimmed hat at kinder, one with a draw string preferably. This is to be worn at kindergarten during times designated in the Victorian Sun Smart guidelines. Educators will ensure the hats are kept clean and fresh and stored correctly.

KINDERGARTEN BAGS

Each child is required to bring their own bag to Kindergarten. The bag needs to be big enough to hold their fruit / lunchbox, artwork, extra clothes.

We encourage children to carry and care for their own bags, as it increases their independence and sense of responsibility.



KINDERGARTEN LIBRARY

A children's library will operate for the four year old kindergarten children groups. This is scheduled to begin at the start of Term 3. Children can borrow books weekly from the Kindergarten library. More information will be given out during first term about library days. Kindergarten Library supports the inclusion of speech and language to our program and is looked upon as a sense of belonging to our community. Parents are more than welcome to donate a book to Kindergarten if they wish.

The library borrowing system allows children a greater opportunity to appreciate books, develop:

- a love of books
- an interest in books
- An interest in stories, words and language
- general knowledge
- imagination

and allows parents and children the opportunity of a special time together.

As we all know, life presents ups and downs, fun times and difficult times. At Kindergarten we have a great library and you may require a story book to help your family through a situation. Please see staff in these times, we may have a story book to support you



FRUIT & LUNCH TIME ROUTINES

Parents will need to provide their child with a whole piece of fruit or vegetable to eat for morning fruit time. This will then be cut up and shared as a group during morning tea time. Lunch is also provided by the parent and we ask you send along a roll, wrap or sandwich, along with another piece of fruit or vegetable and potentially a yoghurt, dry biscuits or cheese. We are part of the smiles for miles program and we take health eating very serious at Kindergarten – regularly discussing 'healthy kindergarten food' and 'sometimes treats'

Please avoid such foods as chips, chocolate, LCM bars, lollies, roll ups, cordial and soft drink. The kindergarten promotes healthy eating and works in compliance with the ECKA Nutrition and active play policy. Please provide your child with a named drink bottle containing water. Our brains love it.

If your child attends the long 7.5 Kindergarten day you will be placed on a roster to provide dry Sakata biscuits, block of cheese or hummus dip.



Please do not hesitate to talk to the teacher regarding your child's nutrition and dietary requirements.

NOTICE BOARD/ ATTENDANCE BOOK/CHILD'S FILE

In the foyer there is a parent notice board where a copy of the items of interest, upcoming events, important dates etc. are displayed. Each child has a file in the filing box, room 2 have theirs in the foyer and children in room 1 have theirs in the room, this is where your child's art work, fee notices or other notices can be found. Please check your child's notes file regularly.

IMPORTANT:

All the necessary notices will be displayed on the Notice Board for parents as well as added to Story Park. Information, newsletters etc. will be also online, however, hard copies will be available in the foyer if required. Please make it a habit to check the notice board, Story Park and your child's note file every day. Important notices/excursions notes will be sent home to be addressed. When required please return any notices back to Kindergarten as soon as possible.

BIRTHDAYS

In the four year old groups, we have begun a tradition of celebrating your child's birthday at kindergarten. The birthday child chooses 3-4 children to be on the birthday committee. The birthday child has the choice of baking a cake, popping popcorn or having a fruit platter to share with the kinder group. This certainly does not limit parents to sending a cake along if you wish. Families are welcome to bring a birthday cake or cupcakes to celebrate their child's birthday. If you make your own cake please send along a list of the ingredients you have placed in it so we can ensure that children with allergies are safe. Please let the staff know in advance if you will be providing something, to allow the parents of children with allergies to provide a safe alternative for their child. Please note if you do not celebrate birthdays for religious or cultural reasons we acknowledge and respect your choice. Please do not hesitate to talk to staff for any preplanning around celebration times. If your child has a food allergy and requires specific ingredients you are welcome to leave a few cupcakes in our freezer for birthday or celebration days.

EXCURSIONS

Excursions can be planned throughout the year. We give careful thought to these events and if they fit in with the interests and learning needs of the group or the educators see it as an important intentional teaching moment then we will consider planning for such an event. We will not however, just do an excursion of the same, every year because it has been done the previous year.

Safety is of key importance; and we are guided by the regulations to complete a safety and risk assessment prior to going on an excursion.

We also really appreciate and need the support from our kindergarten families, so if an excursion comes up and you are free to help we'd love to have you along. On most occasions though, we do need to say "no" to siblings.

A notice is put out asking for a parent (or aunty, grandparent, special friend etc.) to come along to help.

EMERGENCY EVACUATIONS PROCEDURES

We have emergency and evacuation procedures in place at our community kindergarten. Information on our Emergency Evacuation procedure and assembly areas are displayed in the children's room next to the exit doors and one next to the main door. As a part of this emergency evacuation procedure we practice regular fire drills and lock downs with the children at least once every term.

PHOTOGRAPHS/VIDEOS

In order to display your child's photo at Kindergarten we require your written permission, please see the additional forms included in your enrolment pack for details and the authority form.

We have our professional photographer booked for 2023. The four-year-old groups will be photographed the week of 27th of March and the Three-year-old group will be photographed 4th -8th September (Term 3). We will endeavor not to have these dates altered. All parents are notified of this visit but are under no obligation to purchase photos of the group or your child.

ABSCENCES AND ILLNESS

During the year it is quite probable that your child may contract any of the usual children's illnesses – colds, flu, gastric problems, chicken pox, measles, head lice etc. If your child has a cough or fever please keep them at home to help reduce the risk of spreading infection to others.

A list of childhood communicable diseases and the Department of Education & Training recommendations of length of time the child is to be excluded from kindergarten is attached to this booklet. Please read this and keep it for your reference. You can also find a copy hanging in our foyer. Please remember to ring, send a story park message or email to let us know if your child will be away for more than 2 days, due to illness or if going on holidays. Thank you.



LEARNING ACCIDENTS

Children who receive minor injuries at Kindergarten will receive basic first aid. The details of the accident treatment will be recorded in an accident register and parents will be informed and asked to sign at the end of the session. In case of more serious injury, parents

will be immediately informed and medical assistance will be sought. If you seek any medical assistance for your child due to an injury that has occurred at the Kindergarten, please inform the Kindergarten within 24 hours as this needs to reported to ECKA and the Department of Education and Training.

THE HANDLING OF MONEY

For Security reasons ECKA prefers to have no cash on our Kindergarten premises. If you do need to make any cash payments for uniforms etc. please place money in a sealed envelope with your child's name, (and parent's name, if that is different to the child's) the amount, what the money is for and what Kindergarten group the child belongs to written on the outside of the envelope and submit this at our ECKA office.

No money is kept on the Kindergarten premises.

FAMILY INVOLVEMENT

Each year we are asked by families how they can help support the kindergarten and contribute to both our community and the educational programs we provide to the children. There are many different ways that families may contribute in and out of kindergarten sessions. Some of the activities in the kindergarten session may include; attending an excursion, helping the children plant in our vegetable garden, cutting up the shared fruit platter or coming in to read a story, or out of session by supporting social events and providing your feedback and ideas.

If you are interested in volunteering some time to help, please speak directly with the educators or message us via the Storypark app. We understand that people have busy lives and lots of commitments and if you are not able to indicate support right now, we completely understand, however if your circumstances change, please feel free to speak with educators as we will be happy for your help.

Please note that our parent volunteers do not need a working with children's check provided that the volunteering is in the group with your own child. Staff will fully supervise all volunteers in accordance with our volunteer and visitor policies.

LAUNDRY

At the beginning of each year we set up a laundry roster to assist us with the weekly laundry; tea towels, hand towels and art smocks. If you are not able to help us out with this task please let us know.

CUSTODY ISSUES AND COURT ORDERS

We are committed to offer fair and equal access and opportunities to all parties involved in the upbringing of your child, unless otherwise directed by the courts. If there are custody issues, court orders, parenting orders or parenting plans, the teacher should be informed of it immediately and relevant copies of the court orders or parenting plan need to be provided to be kept with your child's enrolment records. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

SMOKING

The kindergarten is a smoke free zone. We ask if you need to smoke you are at least 4 meters away from the center's perimeter. If you attend an excursion with us, we ask that you do not smoke at all. In this instances you are counted as ratio and cannot leave the children.

PARKING AND THE CAR PARK

We have designated parks available, we understand that they are limited. We have attempted to lessen the congestion by starting and finishing the groups at different times. Please be patient in the car park area and we ask that you drive at 10 km or less.

NO JAB NO PLAY LAWS

From 1 January 2016, the Department of Health's '**No Jab**, **No Play**' legislation comes into effect. This legislation requires children enrolled in early childhood services to be fully vaccinated for protection against diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough (pertussis), polio, pneumococcal disease, meningococcal C disease, hepatitis B, *Haemophilus influenzae* type b (Hib), rotavirus, chickenpox (varicella), measles, mumps and rubella (German measles). Prior to commencing Kindergarten, evidence must be provided to the kindergarten that the child is:

- Fully immunised for their age OR
- On a vaccination catch-up program OR
- unable to be fully immunised for medical reasons.

'Conscientious objection' is not an exemption under the 'No Jab No Play' legislation. More information about the 'no jab, no play' policy can be found here -<u>http://www.health.vic.gov.au/immunisation/factsheets/no-jab-no-play.htm</u>

STAFF – PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT DAYS

During the year there will be 2 formal closure days for Staff Professional Development. This is a requirement in our teaching award (VECTEA) to complete these 2 days. Staff may be absent on other days for other Professional Development but the service will not be closed. Families will be notified as soon as possible of these dates.
