

ORGANISATIONAL REPORT

ECKA continued to implement our 2017-2020 Strategic plan with a strong focus on delivering services tailored to meet the needs of the children and families accessing our services. We increased the number of long day kindergarten programs, long day care places and occasional care services to meet the needs of families, which resulted in the organisation maintaining enrolments in our funded kindergarten programs at the level of the previous year. We have been experiencing a yearly downward trend in the number of children enrolled in our unfunded three-year-old kindergarten programs and 2019 resulted in a further decline in these enrolments.

Investment in the ongoing development of our workforce was again a priority as we continued to provide the Educational Leaders within ECKA, networking and mentoring opportunities. Network meetings were attended by all Educational Leaders, which provided opportunities to discuss and increase the understanding of the current changes happening in our sector, including the Victorian Government Reform Plan. Understanding how the reforms impact on our services and planning for the introduction of funded three-year-old kindergarten in 2021 and 2022 was an important part of this work. The networks also focused on quality improvement strategies, including improving our internal organisational systems for developing and evaluating the individual learning and development plans for our workforce and a new system was implemented whereby individual and team development plans are linked to the quality improvement plan for each centre.

Communities of practice meetings continued to identify common issues and enabled ECKA's Early Education Advisors, Teachers and Educators to work together to share knowledge and socialise issues. Meetings focused on a number of subjects including compliance with the Reportable Conduct Laws introduced in January 2019. Systems and strategies were developed to support vulnerable children and children with behavioural and additional needs, as this is identified as an area of increasing concern for each service and often requires intensive resourcing.

Our strategies to provide equitable access for all children focused on fostering strong partnerships and collaborative relationships with families and organisations within our communities to ensure sustained engagement of families and improved outcomes for children. We continued our participation in Local Government Early Years Networks, State-wide Early Years Management (EYM) Networks and celebrated with many local agencies as the benefits of our work together was evidenced through greater participation of vulnerable and disadvantaged children.

Our advocacy for the children and families accessing our services continued through participation on Advisory and Reference Groups that gave us opportunities to jointly inform government policy development and provide feedback on the impact of policy and reforms on our services. Our collaboration with Early Learning Association Australia and its members continued as we lobbied government to provide more funding into EYM and improve longer term sustainability.

We acknowledge that for the first time in our history 2019 has resulted in an operating deficit. This deficit is due to the timing of our wage processing periods, which resulted in an additional wages payment falling into the month of December. This took the total number of fortnightly wages paid in our financial year from the expected 26 to 27.

Since the completion of the 2019 financial year, the emergence of COVID-19 is having a significant and unplanned effect on the operation of our services and an unfolding impact on our finances. The Board and Executive staff have been working overtime to ensure that all risks are being managed and issues dealt with as they arise. The Board will continue to closely monitor and proactively respond to the emerging situation.

We close this report by thanking all our ECKA staff (educators and administration staff) for their work during 2019, acknowledging the work of our CEO, Jo Geurts and most importantly we thank the caregivers and families who enrolled their children in ECKA services in 2019.

2019 FINANCES

Total liabilities of ECKA at the end of 31st December 2019 are \$2,436,940.30, which is 38.46% of total assets, resulting in the association being in a good position to meet all of its current obligations.

As at 31st December 2018 total liabilities were \$2,134,705.88, being 36.02% of total assets. Operating deficit for the year was \$100,056.68 (-1.21%) in comparison to the previous year operating surplus of \$392,367.00 (4.71%). The 2019 financial results were impacted by an unexpected pay period, with the January 1st 2020 payment being bought forward to December 31st. This payment changed the overall operating financial result from an expected surplus to an operating deficit.


There were no other material differences in expenditure against the budget, with the exception of additional expenses when St Alipius Kindergarten joined ECKA in August 2019.

The total income for the organisation was over budget, predominantly due to good returns on the Investment portfolio.

The emergence of COVID-19 in 2020 will impact on the performance of ECKA's investments. The portfolio has a higher proportion of defensive assets which may provide some protection during the pandemic.

Unexpected Government grants were also received in 2019 with Change Management Grants of \$125,000.00 being received to assist ECKA to plan for the implementation of new government reforms, including the introduction of Funded Three Year Old Kindergarten and School Readiness Funding in 2021.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

All ECKA Services develop the daily children's programs based on the Victorian Early Years Learning and Development Framework (VEYLDF).

VEYLDF was developed to guide early childhood professionals, in collaboration with families, toward the achievement of the nationally agreed Early Years Learning Outcomes where children:

- have a strong sense of identity
- are connected with and contribute to their world
- have a strong sense of wellbeing
- are confident and involved learners
- are effective communicators



The VEYLDF guides our early childhood professionals to work together with families in support of their children, embracing and responding to the cultural and linguistic diversity of the Victorian community. Programs are responsive to the interests and development needs of the children, including intensive and remedial programs in a number of our services designed to support our most vulnerable and disadvantaged children.

A number of our educational programs are inspired by high-quality early childhood evidence-based programs and research, such as Reggio Emilia, Montessori, Circle of Security, Sunshine Circles, Effective Provision of Preschool Education (EPPE) study and Australia's E4Kids study. Programs have a strong emphasis on themes important to their individual communities, such as imbedding cultural perspectives and history and involvement in local initiatives and events.

INDIGENOUS PRESCHOOL ADVANCEMENT STRATEGY (IPAS)

The 2019 IPAS project was successful in achieving the intended outcome to increase and sustain participation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children in kindergarten programs.

2019 resulted in a total of 183 children enrolled in kindergarten programs which was 10 more children than 2018. The average attendance rates of children were calculated by the total number of absences of all children and resulted in an attendance rate of 96%.


Feedback provided by parents through our survey provided evidence that 100% of parents are seeing improved sociability, concentration and social-emotional and intellectual development of their children.

There has been ongoing support from the broader service system with our IPAS partners in the Better Outcomes for Our Children Network continuing to work together to support Indigenous children and their families. The Network identified 4 priority objectives to focus their strategies within the Central Highlands area, including:

- 1. To increase participation of ATSI families and children in early years services,
- 2. Strengthen engagement with the local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community to ensure services are inclusive and respectful of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children at every stage of their development.
- 3. To support early years services to be culturally inclusive in order to connect with and sustain the engagement of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families.
- 4. To engage all stakeholders across Central Highlands in the work of the Better Outcomes Network.
 - ♦ 82 Kindergarten Programs supported by IPAS across Grampians Region.
 - ♦ 114 4yo Aboriginal children attending funded kindergarten program.
 - ♦ 55 3yo Early Start in funded Program.
 - ♦ 14 3yo in 3yo kinder.
 - ♦ 96% average attendance rate of all Aboriginal children.

Our favourite thing about Bakery Hill kinder is the fostering of connection to the land and animals, acknowledging the indigenous history and language of country, it is a very important to us and an excellent start for our children.

INTERGENERATIONAL PROGRAMS

Intergenerational programs are providing children and senior members of our community with unique opportunities to spend time together and share experiences and families and Educators are embracing intergenerational learning programs throughout Ballarat and Districts.

Midlands Kindergarten, Hepburn Kindergarten, Ballarat Fidelity Club Kindergarten, Clunes Preschool all visit local Aged Care facilities. Residents and children have come to know each other by name and have created special memories singing, playing, planting, creating and eating together throughout the past year. Children learn from and connect with the older generation which has an impact on children's behaviours and attitudes towards older people and enhance the overall well-being of both young and old participants. Many of the residents said the regular visits from the children helped keep them feeling young and have forged some lovely friendships and it really is just a happy time.

INTENSIVE TEACHING PROGRAM

In 2019 ECKA continued to implement the intensive teaching model at Mt Pleasant Kindergarten and introduced the model into Rowan View Preschool in recognition of the high needs of children in both communities. Additional qualified staff members were employed and staff to child ratios were increased so that more staff were available to plan for and guide smaller groups of children in their learning. The program focused on identifying and assisting children who required additional support,



assisting children to develop the skills needed to regulate their own emotions, as well as introducing essential literacy & numeracy concepts. Educators were provided with advice and support through ECKA Management and other external agencies to assist with the challenges the year presented.

Educational Leader Mt Pleasant Comment: The teacher's role is to be consistent in all approaches in supporting the children, consistent in behaviour guidance, consistent in nurture and making the child feel safe, strong and connected, to guide and support them to understand emotions both big and small. Teachers also support and guide families in assisting their child to develop positive emotional wellbeing, visual resources and strategies, behaviour guidance plans with strategies that are consistent between home and the kindergarten.



BUSH KINDER PROGRAMS





The Bush Kinder Program has been a huge success again this year. Children, families and staff have enjoyed the weekly visits to Pax Hill Scout Camp and Brown Hill Nature Reserve.

Educational Leader Soldiers Hill Kindergarten Comment: It has been interesting to see the different way the children used the bush this year. There was a greater focus on insects and nature and lots more pretend play and exploring. Again we saw children playing in different friendship groups and happy to ideas, discoveries and joys. I think one of the share their greatest benefits that perhaps we can't measure yet, is the benefit to the children's mental health. Staff can feel the sigh of relief as the children feel and hear the bush, relax and become free in nature. This year the staff have also commented on the peacefulness they feel at Bush Kinder. Other benefits observed this year include; improvement in all the children's gross motor skills and confidence, Improved interpersonal skills and contribution to team work, taking risks and testing their limits, building an awareness of the impact we have on our environment, greater awareness of Aboriginal history and culture and an increase in their maths and engineering skills and awareness.

COMMUNITY EVENTS

Partnerships

We acknowledge the important work of all Parents and Friends Activity Groups and Committees in 2019 that were supported by ECKA staff to undertake their roles. Parents were supported to contribute to fundraising and social activities and contribute to their child's education.
